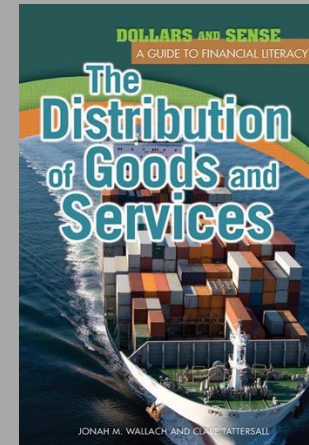
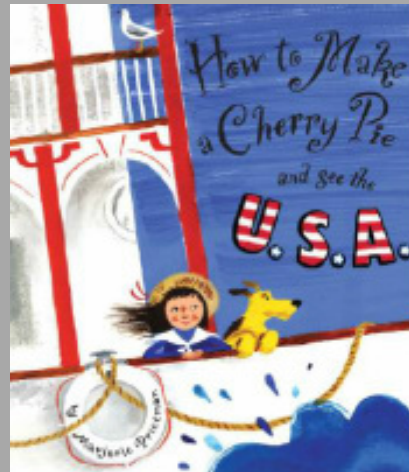

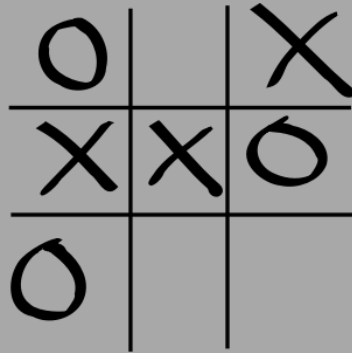
The Distribution of Goods and Services

Dollars and Sense: A Guide to Financial Literacy

This insightful book explores the details of the supply chain, specifically the distribution of goods and services. From the origin of goods and services, as raw materials or laborers, to their final use by consumers, the path of distribution is described in straightforward language. Students learn about the four main marketing channels, merchant and functional middlemen, direct sales, retailing, wholesaling, transportation and business logistics, the marketing of products to consumers, and online shopping and delivery. The narrative also includes information about outsourcing and online marketing. \$26

After discussing why we trade, students will try to unscramble and arrange the places, parts and phases of producing a pair of Nikes into a coherent story of global production. Students will finish by evaluating the economic, environmental and social impact of this approach to production.



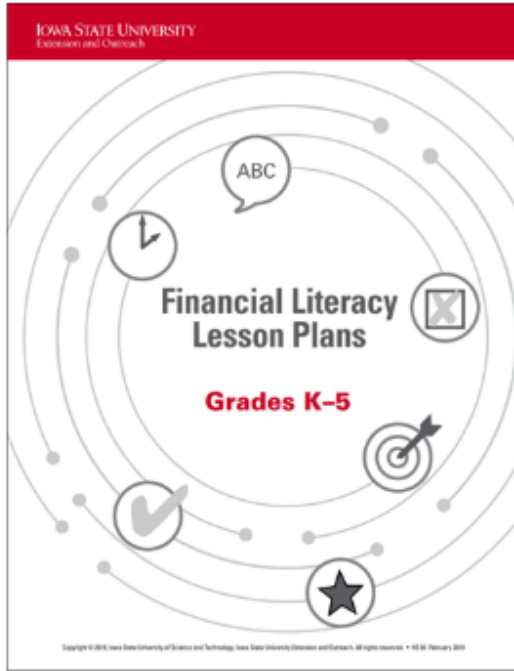
This lesson involves students in a trading simulation designed to illustrate a complex marketplace in which goods and services are traded. Students use this experience to investigate the conditions that encourage or discourage trade among individuals.

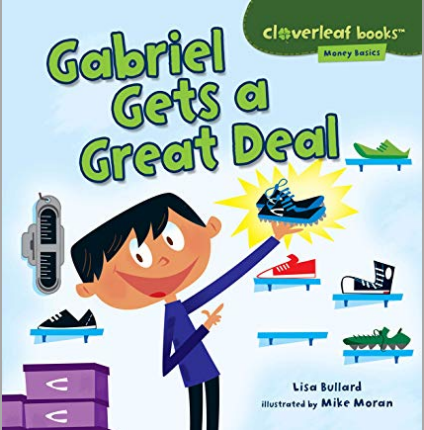
5.16 DEMONSTRATE WAYS TO MONITOR HOW MONEY IS SPENT AND SAVED.



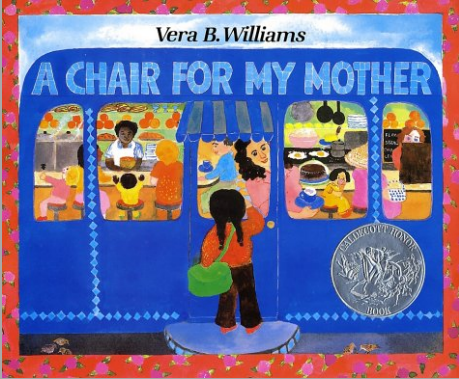
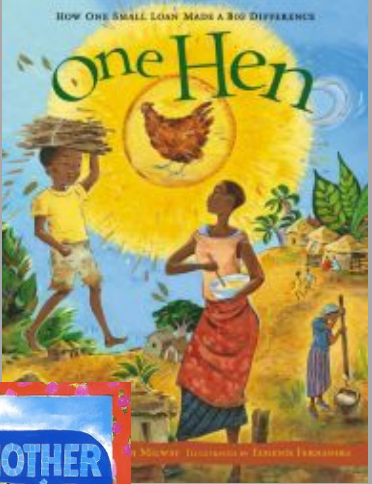
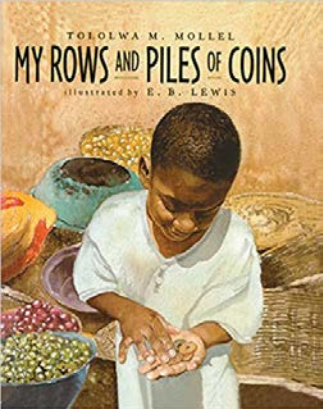
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		Allowance	Gift	Chares	Purchase	Gift

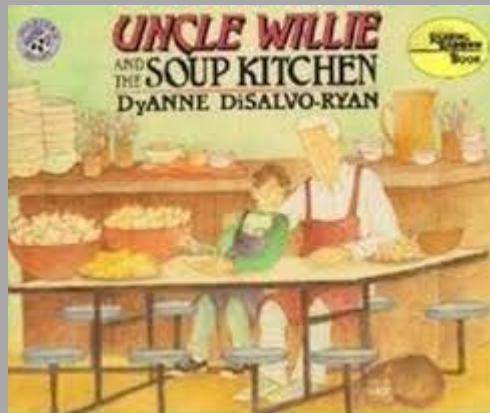


My Rows and Piles of Coins

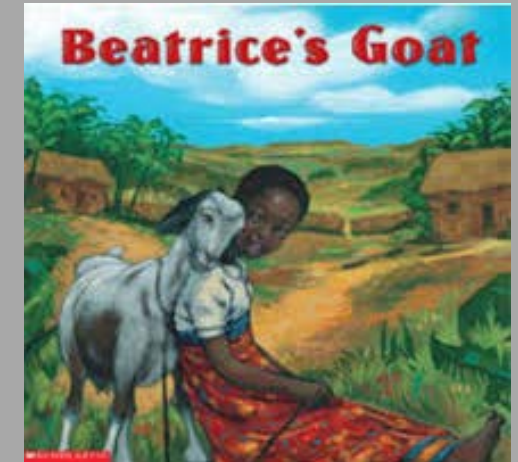
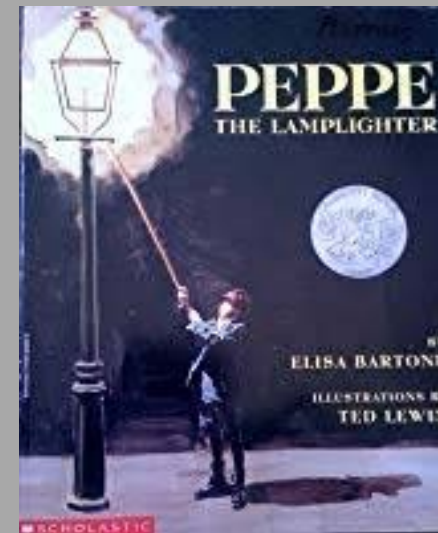
5.17 GIVE EXAMPLES OF FINANCIAL RISKS THAT INDIVIDUALS AND HOUSEHOLDS FACE.

Illness
Injury
Relocation
Disability
Unemployment
Natural Disaster
Change in employment (new job; reduced hours; etc.)
Change in family status (marriage; baby; adoption; death; divorce; etc.)
Mortgage or other loan debt
Many of these overlap and impact each other and lead to other dangers such as hunger and homelessness.
